Our school is equipped with state-of-the-art facilities designed to support the learning and development of our students. From our sensory rooms and adapted sports facilities to our braille and assistive technology resources, we strive to create an environment where every student feels valued and empowered. We also place a strong emphasis on fostering independence and self-advocacy, providing all students with the skills and confidence they need through our personalised mobility and habilitation courses to enable them to navigate the world beyond our school gates.

In addition to our academic routes, we are proud to offer a wide range of extra-curricular and enrichment activities that promote social interaction, physical health and personal development. Whether it's through music production, art, sports, or community-based projects, we encourage all our students to explore their interests and develop their talents.

Inclusive Education: Provide a broad, rich and accessible curriculum that meets the needs of all children and young people with sensory impairments.

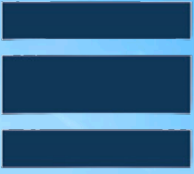
Preparation for Adulthood: Prepare all young people with the essential life skills to live confidently and independently.

Curriculum

At St Vincent's School we offer a broad and balanced curriculum that includes full access to the National Curriculum from Key Stages 1 through to 5 and all areas of the Curriculum Framework for Children and Young People with Visual Impairment (CFVI).

All pupils study a range of qualifications from Entry Levels to GCSEs and BTECs.

Across all Key Stages, the curriculum is modified and differentiated to enable each pupil access to the National Curriculum in an appropriate and meaningful way. Curriculum maps have been carefully sequenced to provide learning opportunities across the whole range of National Curriculum areas. Topics within each subject are revisited so that pupils can consolidate and build knowledge and skills.

At Post-16, students continue to have access to a broad and balanced curriculum with the opportunity to study an array of accreditations that balance academic rigour with further curriculum offerings. Alongside this, Post-16 groups follow the Preparation for Adulthood (PfA) pathways.

St Vincent's offers a range of core therapies that work in-line with individual EHCPs, providing access and support for children and young people through:

- Speech and Language Therapy (SaLT)
- Educational Psychologist
- Physiotherapy
- Music Therapy
- Lego Therapy and Braille Lego

This provision is reviewed and updated annually as required to reflect the needs of children and young people.







Curriculum

Our Enrichment curriculum enables pupils to enhance their learning through focussed activities. These activities also foster social and emotional growth by providing structured environments for building friendships and teamwork skills. These activities help children discover new interests and develop essential skills not typically in school such as Grow Wild (horticulture), Horse Riding, Yoga, Musical Theatre, Coding, The Big Debate Club, Young Green Briton and Maths Berbas Challenges.

School offers an exciting and extensive extra-curricular programme which is on offer for both day, extended and residential pupils. These activities include VI football, Choir, the school allotment and health-related fitness.

Pupils have access to an extensive Outdoor Education programme which includes, but is not limited to The Duke of Edinburgh's Award, residential trips to the Calvert Trust and Eden Projects Ministry of Eco Education. St Vincent's School is a Royal Horticulture Society Level 5 school. Staff are RHS, BELA and Lowland qualified to deliver these activities on and off-site.

All pupils, at all year groups have weekly swimming lessons delivered by our own ASA Swimming Coach. These lessons also include water safety and water-based sports including water polo.

Beyond the Curriculum

At St Vincent's School we are aware of the many challenges children and young people with visual impairments face. Whether this be building wider friendship groups, having access to local inclusive facilities or opportunities to engage in regular and meaningful physical activity.

Residential School

At St Vincent's we offer an impressive residential group staffed by a dedicated and highly trained Care Staff team who are always on call to offer help and support to pupils, parents and carers in any way they can.

If you are a residential pupil at St Vincent's School you have the option of a full time residential placement, Monday to Friday, part time or extended evening stays to help support and develop your independence skills.

Each resident has their own Key Worker, this staff member is responsible for working closely with pupils to support them through their Key Working Sessions - this could be anything from independent living skills, personal care and hygiene.

All residential pupils are provided with their own bedroom and a Waking Night Officer is on-hand each evening throughout the night.

Residential pupils combine school learning with a home from home - and a wider-ranging after-school offer is available to all. This will include activities such as horse riding, allotment, swimming, off-site trips and visits to local facilities.

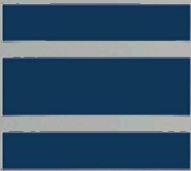
